

INDUSTRIAL RECORD.

On the industrial side, I have been equally active, having spent most of my life in the industries around the West Sydney district.

My industrial experience has been closely related to waterfront industries, and this alone would give me a particular advantage if I am the successful candidate.

After an apprenticeship of five years as a fitter, turner and mechanical draftsman, I went to sea in 1922.

I joined the Seamen's Union, on finding it difficult to obtain a position of ship's engineer, and on going through the phases of trimmer, fireman and greaser, I was appointed 5th engineer when a vacancy occurred.

During my years at sea I travelled extensively in merchant vessels to the British Isles, America, Africa, Europe, Egypt, Persia and India, where I availed of every opportunity to study the conditions of workers in industry and on the waterfront in other countries.

On leaving the sea I obtained employment at Mort's Dock and Eng. Company, Balmain, and joined the Australian Society of Engineers. Later I held the position of Mechanical Draftsman of this firm and Chief Estimator, a position which entailed the preparation of all tenders and the handling of all contracts.

It will be seen, therefore, that my industrial experience is of the kind which specially fits me to represent a constituency where workers are primarily engaged in shipping and waterfront industries.

At present I am in business manufacturing anaesthetic machines and general hospital equipment of my own design, and am a member of the Amalgamated Engineering Union.

I confidently ask for your No. 1 vote, knowing that even those who do not support me will not deny that I have had a long and honourable association with Labor in West Sydney. Through good times and depression I have tried to do the right thing by the people of West Sydney. I leave my record to speak for itself.

If I am selected I will represent you vigorously and honourably. If I am not selected, then I will loyally support—as I have always done—the Official Labor candidate.
